

NextComputing Restriction of Hazardous Substances Compliance Statement

NextComputing is committed to compliance with the RoHS Directive (Directive 2002/95/EC) from the European Union (EU). NextComputing also is committed to complying with requirements of other applicable current or future environmental laws, where NextComputing does business. NextComputing's RoHS compliance planning is based on conformance to the RoHS Directive issued by the EU, and not on any specific Member State legislation or legislation from any other countries. As other environmental regulations are passed by the U.S. or other countries in which NextComputing does business, NextComputing's compliance planning will respond accordingly.

NextComputing is relying on the lead-in-solder exemption for servers and storage arrays as all of our products are mobile and small footprint servers with storage array options internally or externally. The electronics industry is examining the data on lead-free solder and NextComputing is reviewing data on lead-free solder in conjunction with our suppliers to move beyond the exemption for certain product lines including the NextDimension and Vigor Opteron series.

Labeling is not required by the RoHS Directive and no industry or regulatory standard for RoHS labeling exists. Currently, NextComputing does not intend to label products as RoHS-compliant.
